Do not try to open the eyes by manipulation. Wash thoroughly with warm water. Apply a moist gauze patch. Do not apply (chemical) neutralizing agents without medical advice. Take victim to an ophthalmologist.

Do not try to pull the lips with a direct opposing action. Apply lots of warm water and saliva. Do not apply (chemical) neutralizing agents without medical advice. Immediately consult a doctor/medical service.
